Years ago friends from rural Kenya traveled to Duluth. It was the first time they had been away from Kenya, and they were amazed at all the different things they experienced. They couldn't believe all of the water in Lake Superior, and how cold it can be here. (That was in May!) They laughed with amazement as we drove through the tunnels, and they mourned that the trees had no leaves on them. Our friends were in a whole different world from what they were used to. Their view of the world was changed by people and experiences they had never imagined, and the trip was a life changing experience.

We all have experiences that are life changing. Small things that change us in little ways, and dramatic experiences that really change our lives. Sometimes change brings rejoicing, other times mourning, but rarely is change unnoticed. Change can knock us off balance, and sometimes make it hard to move forward in life. When we get stuck by change we become so focused on what has happened that our world becomes smaller, possibilities decrease, and hope diminishes. Our Easter faith, has a lot to say to us about this.

Think about the disciples and all of the change they faced. They followed, admired, and loved Jesus. He was their hope for a better future. All of this came crashing down when he was arrested, crucified, and buried. It would have been very easy for the disciples to get stuck in the time of the cross. With Jesus' presence in the Holy Spirit, however, the disciples did move on from the cross. Throughout the book of Acts we can read many times they prayed together, and with the Holy Spirit did amazing things in the name of Christ.

We are Easter people. People who are supposed to have moved beyond the cross and the suffering it represents to the hope, love, and glory of the risen Christ present in our lives through the Holy Spirit. We need to recognize not only that we face changes in life, but we also need to examine what really changes us. Are we only changed by people, experiences, pressures, and fears? Are we changed also by our faith? Easter faith is faith that is life changing, each and every day. Sometimes we are changed by dramatic spiritual experiences, but most often we are gently molded by the working of God's Spirit. When we do things to nurture our relationship with Christ, such as pray, worship, read the Bible, give to God, serve others in the name of Christ, then we allow God's Spirit to be a changing force in our lives.

An Easter reality is, if we aren't being changed by our faith, then our faith isn't alive and thriving. Perhaps it is lying dormant, just like trees in winter before the new growth of spring. Even if this is the case, a promise of Easter is that we can always turn to God and find new life. When we do find new life in Christ our understanding of the world is transformed and we can face life's challenges and changes with a greater sense of hope, purpose, and vitality.

Traveling to a different country can certainly expand our understanding of the world and transform lives, as our friends from Kenya revealed. What can really help us grow, however, is our faith. Nurture your Easter faith. Doing so will introduce you to people and things you never imagined, and will change your life in ways that will also change the world. The risen Christ is with us. May we be Easter people willing to embrace Christ's life giving and life changing Spirit!



GROWING FAITH PAGE

Faith that is alive is a faith that is growing and changing our lives. A vital faith is also changing the world around us. To have a lively, transforming Christian faith means being grounded in a relationship with Jesus Christ which takes commitment and the willingness to open our hearts to God’s Holy Spirit.

Recommended Scripture Readings: The children’s program this spring is going to be on some of the parables Jesus told to teach us about God, our relationships with God, and how to live out our faith in God. Read these stories while asking questions such as: What does this lesson teach me about how to live in our world today? What do I need to change about how I live?

Spiritual Growth Challenge: Set aside some prayer time each day. During your prayer time try some “Lectio Divino” which is praying the Scriptures. Pick a verse or two, read through it several times (silently and out loud), pray and meditate with the words of Scripture in your heart, and read through the reading again. This form of prayer can help the Scriptures become a living part of our lives, and help us know God’s wisdom in new ways.

PRAYER ~ PICNIC ~ PARABLE ~ PROMISE

“Catholic theologian, James Allison, describes faith not as making an intellectual assent to a set of theological propositions, but he describes faith as *relaxing*. Relaxing in the love and presence of God in the way we relax in the presence of someone we are certain is fond of us. When we are in the presence of someone we are certain is fond of us, we are funnier, more spontaneous, softer and less defended. If I know for sure someone likes and loves me there is no reason to pretend anything.” Faith is relaxing.

I read the above words from Nadia Bolz Weber’s sermon and I am reminded how often I hear those I talk with saying, with weariness or anxiety, or a look of maybe regretful apology, “I would, but we are so busy.” From others they intone “I’m so busy,” with pride or as a mark of their ability to withstand stress as a mark of character. Is whizzing through life now its definition of success?

There is a story told in seminary, probably apocryphal, of a study that was done. Some volunteers were sent on an errand across campus with no firm deadline or expectation as to time. Other volunteers were told to hurry to complete the errand because someone was waiting for them. For both groups, a person acting as if in need was placed in their path. Those in a hurry, perhaps like the Levite, and the Priest in the story of the Good Samaritan, felt they carried special responsibility, and hastened by. Those volunteers with no expectation about time, stopped and offered aid. The question is who owns our time? To whom are we giving our life? The Chinese pictograph for “busy” is composed of two characters: *heart and killing*.

I invite you to practice Sabbath-keeping. For as Rabbi Abraham Herschel says, “It is not so much that we ‘keep the sabbath as that the sabbath keeps us — keeps us whole, keeps us sane, keeps us spiritually alive.” When keeping Sabbath, we remember who we are and whose we are. We are God’s, not Pharaoh’s; we are given the commandment to keep the Sabbath as a blessing so that when we are embraced by the restfulness of our loving, gracious God and we are also protected and sheltered from the restless anxiety of Pharaoh.

Jesus said, “Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.” (Matthew 11.28) Notice how you can come for a moment – hum the doxology to yourself: *Praise God, whose image we all bear; Praise Christ, whose mercy we all share; Praise Spirit, making justice grow— One God from whom all blessings flow!*; come for 10 minutes: read Psalm 139 and remember that you are “*awesomely and wondrously made;*” Come for a day, a day in the wilderness to sort temptation from Spirit’s call to live in love. Come away and rest in the faith that will then soon rest in you. And the children will be blessed by your gift of showing them that they have a choice between servitude to Pharaoh’s consumer culture and freedom in God’s love.

This will be a great session for those seeking an understanding of privilege and anyone looking for effective ways to talk about it.

We are excited to inform you that we have a new Administrative Assistant, Lorli Waitas.


