BLESSED TO BE A BLESSING: STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

The theme for this year's stewardship campaign comes from the story of God's call to Abraham and Sarah. They were to leave their homeland and travel afar. God would give them land and progeny, and promised that "all peoples on earth would be blessed" through them.

Throughout salvation's history, God's blessing comes through human beings. God promised to bless the world through Abraham and Sarah's family. God promised to bless the world through the people of Israel. God promised to bless the world through Jesus, born in Bethlehem, raised in Nazareth, killed in Jerusalem and raised up from the dead. God promised to bless the world through the disciples, empowered by the Holy Spirit who blew through them on Pentecost.

And still God's blessings come to us through human beings: folks who love us in spite of our faults; families who forgive us and show us grace; teachers who encourage us; friends who support us in times of sorrow, grief, illness and disappointment; the church community where people we may not even know help us express gratitude, challenge us to be our best, and share in the work of blessing the world. We are blessed!

The fall stewardship campaign gives each of us the opportunity to ask ourselves how much we are willing and/or able to commit to financially supporting Pilgrim's call to be a place of blessing. For the past ten years, much of our financial energy has gone into paying off the roof mortgage. The roof and renovations in 2005 have allowed Pilgrim to become a kind of community center. We provide space for music lessons, choral groups, support groups, yoga lessons, a catering business, child care and much more—all in addition to what we offer as a congregation. We have been blessed with congregational support and are a blessing to the neighborhood. The good news is that we have less than \$25,000 of the mortgage to pay off!

The next big challenge? If we could increase giving to the operating budget and thereby decrease the annual deficit, we would be better able to support our program needs and outreach in the name of the church. Recently, the ministry committees submitted their ideas about the needs they see in the next 1-3 years. The comprehensive budget working group will sort through those needs to develop priorities.

Because there are continuing capital needs in the building, and because we are still paying off the roof, this year's pledge cards still have two designations: capital needs and operating needs.

I hope you will carefully consider the ongoing, operating expenses of the congregation. Your help will give us the opportunity to better support the programs already in place by which we bless each other and the community around us. As the real-life drama unfolds we see this John Doe, denied an identity at his point of death, become a living and breathing human being with an important life story. SEARCH UPDATE

As you probably know, Charlotte's last Sunday at Pilgrim will be January 4. As your moderator, I wanted to let you know where we are in the search process and what steps the Church Council is taking to ensure that we find a new minister to lead us in worship and to nurture the spiritual life of Pilgrim Congregational Church. Here is a brief overview of the process.

The first step is to select an interim minister. The Council appointed Diane Desotelle, Steve Cushing and Nate Stumme as the interim search committee. They have been working to identify the skills we are looking for in the interim minister and then put together an Interim Ministry Profile. This will be submitted to our Conference Minister, Rick Wagner. The Conference will then provide profiles and resumes of candidates who fit our profile. The interim search committee will review these profiles and resumes and identify potential candidates who will be invited for the interview process. Once the interim search committee selects the candidate who they believe meets our needs, they will make a recommendation to the Church Council. We hope to find an interim who can stay with us while we are searching for a settled minister.

After the interim minister is selected, we will initiate the search process for our new minister. We will begin by selecting a Search Committee composed of five to nine members of the Church. We want to include, as much as possible, an equal representation of men and women, young and old, and new and long-time members. More information on the criteria for membership on the Search Committee will be provided as we get closer to the time to begin this step. The slate of members of the Search Committee will be presented to the congregation for ratification.

The Search Committee will then begin the process which includes preparing a Local Church Profile, preparing a compensation package and listing the vacancy in the national document, United Church Employment Opportunities. The profile is a detailed document with information about our congregation, our priorities for ministry and our hopes for the next period of our congregation's life. The Search Committee will review profiles and resumes of the candidates, conduct interviews, and make a recommendation to the Church Council. The congregation will have the opportunity to meet the recommended candidate, experience worship, and then will act on the recommendation from the Search Committee and Church Council. The search process may take 12-18 months to complete. We will continue to update the congregation on the progress as much as possible.

PILGRIM BUDGET INFORMATION

Expenditures for the month were significantly greater than revenue. Quarterly expenditures are normally greater than other months due to quarterly payments for employee benefits, insurance and budgeted donations. However, revenue was down from last year in September by \$9,000. The YTD deficit is only \$3,788 less than budgeted for the entire year. Timely payment of pledge balances for 2014 is needed for cash flow.
