We have been journeying together seven weeks, and bit by bit I am getting to know you, individually and as Pilgrim Church. Know how grateful I am when you wear your nametag! And know that I appreciate it when you remind me when else we have talked, or point out a relative. Your attention to little things like these help me tremendously.

The first big step in securing a new called (aka “settled” or “permanent”) pastor is under way as the Council begins reviewing your nominations and asking persons to serve on the **Search Committee**. A slate should be ready for your vote at next May’s congregational meeting.

The four at-large Council members have also agreed to serve as a **Transition Team** to work with me on some of the tasks of this season. Please feel free to approach any of them, as well as myself, with any questions, ideas, or concerns regarding this interim season. Team members are Diane Desotelle, Deb Devaney, Clyde Johnson, and David Zentner.

One task of the Transition Team is to revisit the stories and history of Pilgrim Congregational Church. Besides the fine written pieces by Mike Zlonis, we want to learn from you what looms large in your memories, and how these make Pilgrim Church what it is to you. **Join us on Sunday, April 19 for a special “Telling Our Story” event**, and let us know what matters from your perspective.

In the weeks following this event, we will be sponsoring **a series of smaller-group gatherings** to ask you more questions about Pilgrim Church, testing what we heard on April 19 and listening to you reflect on the present and future of this church. All of this will help us better identify the church’s identity, mission, and vision at this time to guide the work of this interim season, which includes **coming to terms with history, discovering a new identity, and commitment to new directions in ministry**. This work will also help the Search Committee as they develop the Local Church Profile for potential pastoral candidates. The more participants, the more faithful our discernments.

One other interim task is tending to leadership. This is vital in any season, but is especially crucial in an in-between time. You are such a capable congregation, with gifts diverse, strong, and abundant! Those who lead are not called to do their tasks alone. *Their real job is to draw out your gifts and put them to good use in fulfilling God’s dreams for Pilgrim Congregational Church.*

Over the last few years you revised your organizational structure to be more grassroots – more Congregational if you will, and more reflective of the UCC ethos of God’s empowerment and call of each person. **Any church is only as alive as its people are committed and involved. And individually, we only get out of a venture according to what we are willing to put into it.** (That’s a corollary to gaining life only by losing it – see Jesus, as quoted by Mark 8:31-38.) So: where do your passions fit our church’s needs?

As we live towards Resurrection, I encourage you to accompany each other and me along the Way, through worship and work, willing to sacrifice and thus able to embrace new life. See you Sundays!

**2014 PILGRIM ENERGY ROUNDUP**

Pilgrim ended 2014 with its yearlong flurry of energy efficiency activity finally quieting down at the holidays. Since then, we've been watching our utility bills come and go, and here is what we know about the energy actions taken thus far (2013 and 2014)...

**We spent some \$.** About \$50,000, paid for by a combination of a 0% interest loan from Center for Energy and the Environment, our repair budget, a specific allocation by church council, rebates, and donations from you. Projects included interior and exterior lighting replacement, seasonal interior weatherization, water saving measures, and HVAC modifications.

**We received some great help.** We were greatly assisted by over \$13,000 in rebates and grants from Comfort Systems and Minnesota Power! We were also allocated wonderful analytical and consultative resources from the utilities, at no cost to our own budget.

**We saved some \$, and look to save more this year.** Energy savings as a result of these actions saved us *\$8200 in avoided utility costs in 2013 and 2014*. This year, we are expecting to save much more, and we are on track, having already avoided utility costs of *\$1300 in the first billing month of 2015*. We expect full payback from these energy investments to occur by the end of 2017, the buildings' 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

**We are saving a lot of energy and helping the planet in the process!** These investments will allow us to cut our annual energy and water use by 1/3, which will remove 112 tons of CO2 from our carbon footprint annually. That is the equivalent of taking 24 cars off the road!

**We are not done yet.** We are looking at more actions this year that can help our building and reduce our energy use. In fact, in the next 2 years we see many feasible, affordable, high return energy investments that can help us cut our energy and water footprint in half by 2017, put our church on more secure financial foundation, and direct our focus upon our wider mission of community service and engagement.

Thanks Pilgrim, pat yourself on the back, and stick around, the best is yet to come!

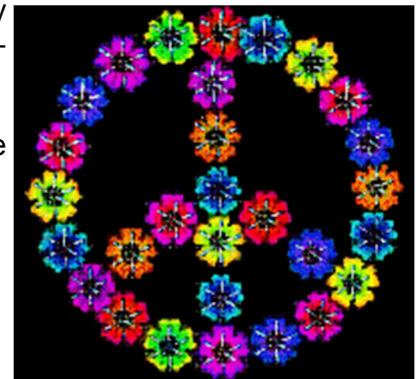

**FREE PHYSICAL ASSESSMENT FOR SENIORS**

The **College of St. Scholastica (CSS)** physical therapy students will be offering a general fitness assessment with an emphasis on determining fall risk to the general public as part of a community service project that will be held on Monday, April 20, 2015 and Tuesday, April 21, 2015 between 1:30 – 3:00 pm at The College of St. Scholastica physical therapy department.

The preferred population for the assessment are adults over the age of 60. Students will assess general strength, flexibility, mobility, cardiovascular endurance, and balance. The assessments should not take more than 30-40 minutes. Students will share their findings and recommendations with you.

Students will be supervised by Dr. Sandy Marden-Lokken, a licensed physical therapist who is a faculty member in the CSS physical therapy program.
