
We have a lot of exciting things going on at Pilgrim Church (UCC)! Sometimes the busyness makes my head spin, but there have been so many meaningful moments at Pilgrim that I often feel God's smile touch my soul. I hope you have been feeling God's smile as well. Worship this Lenten season has been particularly packed full of powerful moments and I have no doubt God's Spirit is dancing among us on Sunday mornings.

Special moments include: the children's participation in worship, blessing young boys of a visiting choir, celebrating women with a liturgy by Jackie Falk and a dialogue sermon with Rev. Kirstin Batchelor, beautiful music performed by our musicians and written by Rachael, and a witness by Ever about his childhood in Honduras and God's work in his life.

The richness of worship has also been fostered by the wonderful stories from Jesus' ministry. Some of the lessons we have learned from the Scripture readings in this Lenten season's worship series, *Making Room at the Table*, include:

- God's work through Jesus is not confined to social or religious expectations.
- Faith includes showing respect and compassion for others even when we struggle with what they believe or do.
- We need to foster humility in our lives so we can turn to God and others for help.
- Living out our faith often requires us to shift our perceptions about other people, ourselves, and the world around us.
- Women and men both have important gifts and leadership to bring to the table. We need to look outside of gender, racial, and other stereotypes to see people as God sees them.
- Knowing God's grace we can work and live with a perspective that there is 'enough for everyone' and encourage each other, rather than competing with a perspective scarcity.
- God's work can be radical and dramatic making big changes in peoples' lives and in the world.
- When we courageously live out our faith and accept change in our own lives we can be a part of God's work in the world bringing about grace-filled changes.
- Jesus was not wishy washy about who deserved God's grace, but radical and decisive. He did not hesitate to defy others when they were trying to limit people from experiencing God's work.
- Letting go of the need to understand everything and embracing faith helps us to see God's work.
- When we live out our faith in Jesus and talk about our faith with others, God does work through us!

I pray that as we worship and work in ministry together you are nourished to feel God's Spirit dancing in your life throughout each day of the week. May this holy season give us pause to reflect on how much we are given by God. May Easter give us the ability to experience God's work in such a way that our souls smile and we know without a doubt we are God's beloved children empowered to change the world with grace.

GROWING FAITH PAGE

Holy Week, beginning with Palm Sunday and ending with Easter Sunday is the most powerful week of the Christian year. The meaning and significance of that week is foundational to who we are as disciples of Jesus Christ. To experience some of that deep meaning it is important to look at the whole story of Jesus. Overlooking the pain and suffering of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion means missing out on the significance of Jesus' love and gift to us. Focusing only on the pain and suffering would lead us to miss out on the joy and hope of Christ's resurrection. Make sure you take in some of the meaningful events offered through our church and in the community that help to look at the whole story of Jesus' final week walking on this world.

Do not allow any of us to remain apathetic or indifferent to the wondrous glory of Easter, but let the light of our risen Lord reach every corner of our dull hearts. Amen.


SHARE THE HOPE AND JOY OF EASTER SEASON



PRAYER ~ PICNIC ~ PARABLE ~ PROMISE

If you've been in a conversation with me about how we as a faith community equip our youth to live out and more lead in the living out of the love ethos that is the way of Jesus you have likely heard my "elevator speech" about Peer Ministry Leadership Training (PML). PML is a program that we introduced earlier this year by an all-day training in November. Cindy Grindy, Pastor Karen, five youth and I participated.

Here is PML's back story: It is rooted in the work of Dr. Barbara Varenhorst, a school counselor in Palo Alto, CA. She would ask her students, "Who do you go to when there is something going on in your life or you see something that concerns you for a friend?" Her observation: they never said, "You, Barbara!" Instead they almost always mentioned a friend, a peer, as one of the first people they confided in. Barbara's premise, "Why am I not giving my students the skills to care, welcome and affirm others?" Dr. Varenhorst began a statewide initiative in California called Peer Counseling that quickly spread across the country, taking on various forms and titles. Churches started asking Barbara to work with them and so she created Peer Ministry, an on-going program that is now led by Lyle Griner, who led the November training.



So here is a great relational tool from PML that works for any age. An acronym, simply put, W.H.E.A.T. is a great way to remember questions if you're talking to someone for the first time and want a starting place that welcomes comfortable conversation. W: **Where** are you from? H: What **hobbies** do you have? E: What **events** (what's happened) in your life recently? A: What **acquaintances** do we both know? T: What are your favorite places you've **traveled**? I'll admit that I have been relentlessly enthusiastic and I want to share why I think Peer Ministry is good for our youth and good for our congregation.

For many of us, though, there is one particular image from all the different activities that we did in Peer Ministry that stays with us. It is the inward and outward facing circles. When we talked about what it means to invite people into a group, we first had the image of the inward facing circle. Holding hands in a circle, facing each other, this image is pretty typical of many groups that develop, feeling closeness with those we're with. But we often don't realize that any visitor coming to try to join in, faces only our backs that are a barrier to joining in and feeling welcome. Then we turned the circle outward, still holding hands and connecting with each other, but facing any outsiders and welcoming them to our group. What a contrast of experience. Offering this welcoming hospitality in daily life takes intentionality and sometimes requires giving up what we might really want that easy closeness and safety of a closed group. But not only is facing outward what we're called to in PML, it also lays the ground for potential new, rich relationships that we might not have otherwise explored. It is the beginning of what Jesus described as the Realm of God.

The director of Peer Ministry, Lyle, always says that if youth aren't leading, they're leaving. I look forward to our youth having a whole new set of relational tools and ways of thinking about ministry—one that encourages them to be caring leaders. So let's continue to invite our youth into leadership opportunities, giving them the chance to help us continue to become an outward facing church, expecting great things of them and ourselves. In doing so, we help our whole congregation live out that inspiring vision of enough for all, a place where all are welcome.
