Dear Friends,

Pilgrim is beginning a new era in its life as a congregation. We have many assets--a long history of service to the community; a passion for social justice; and a desire that faith be both heart-felt and intellectually stimulating. We have a beautiful building; a talented staff; and legacy funds that supplement our current income. Pilgrim has carved out a significant place in the community. We've welcomed guests, visitors and new members into our congregation. We have much for which to give thanks.

We are now approaching the end of a huge financial burden—the debt we incurred to replace the roof is very close to being paid off. Many Pilgrims gave substantially to this effort. We also depended on our legacy funds to help us as well. One of those funds, the Pilgrim Fund was a large bequest left to the congregation in 1991. After wide spread discussion, the congregation designated its use for ministry and outreach initiatives. When we faced the challenge of the roof, the congregation voted to use it to help finance that endeavor.

Meanwhile, the 2nd Century funds have been used to cover deficit operating expenses. When it was established, the intention was to provide operating expense support from the proceeds of the fund. We have often withdrawn more than that in order to support our operations.

This spring the Church Council initiated discussion about Pilgrim's goals and priorities for the immediate future and over the next five years. Ministry committees are currently compiling information and in the fall the Council will begin to sort through the ideas generated.

This is not just a discussion about money. This discussion is about what Pilgrim will become in the near future. What kind of investments will this congregation make in itself, in its building, and in the wider community? This discussion will lead toward identifying the most immediate and longer range priorities.

In January I will be retiring from my service at Pilgrim. An interim minister will serve you while you search for another called minister. My best guess is that part of the interim's ministry will be to help you further identify, refine, and begin to work toward whatever priorities you identify.

I know that you will attend to the needs of the building. My prayer is that you will also find ways to increase the congregation's support for the ministry and mission to which Pilgrim is called: to feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, care for each other, nurture the development of faith in children and adults and worship God with music, art and other expressions of the human spirit.

At the moment, Alex and I plan to remain in Duluth at least through his high school years. I look forward to enjoying life here and getting to know people in contexts other than the church.

The work I am doing this summer will help leave a cleaner path (and office) for the persons who come after me. It will also give me time to make some of the preparations I need to make at home and in my personal life.

Enjoy the summer. Keep the faith. Take care of each other. Breathe in the spirit. God is with us.

**FRED LUND, SUMMER
SABBATICAL SUPPLY**

The Rev. Fred Lund will serve Pilgrim for seven weeks this summer while Charlotte is on her “back burner” sabbatical. He will conduct worship services June 29, throughout July, and August 3 and 10. He will also be available for pastoral emergencies or crises and will work with the BeFrienders to be sure that Pilgrims are well cared for during the summer.

Fred served Eastridge Community Church here in Duluth from 1980 until his retirement a few years ago. Prior to that he served a congregation in South St. Paul and did mission work in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Community service has always been important to Fred and he spent more years than he can count working with CHUM and served as its Treasurer. In his retirement, Fred continues to serve not-for-profits dedicated to creating low income housing and advocating on behalf of low income households.

Fred and his wife Sharon have three grown children: David, an attorney, Juli, also an attorney, and Susan, a foreign language educator.

Fred studied at Bethel University in St. Paul, Minnesota, majoring in history and education. He earned his M. Div. at Bethel Theological Seminary and later earned a Doctorate degree in Church Renewal and Development at McCormick Seminary.

Beekeeping has been an ongoing hobby of Fred's since junior high.

Fred is looking forward to serving Pilgrim this summer and has already attended the annual meeting, been present in worship, and met with Rachael Kresha to help plan services. His hope for the summer is that this can be time for all of us to grow closer to the God we love and serve.

EXTRAVAGANT WELCOME
How Do We Welcome?

How do we welcome? That is something I have thought about and after attending a workshop at the UCC Conference at St. Benedict College. I now have a few answers and of course more questions. Yes I know we are an ONA church welcoming all and we have a large banner exclaiming our "Extravagant Welcome", but how do we "really" welcome people to our church?

Here are some ideas that we all can think about and maybe discuss among us. These are questions and I will put my personal responses in italics. Feel free to read through them and think about how you would answer the question and then let's apply them next time we see a stranger in our church.

How do we know when we are welcome? *For me it is a feeling of true, honest and a personal welcoming from members, employers or true strangers. I can tell when it is genuine and not just a "commercial" welcome. A warm handshake or a good hug means so much.*

How would you describe what it feels like to be welcome?....What does it look like. Sound like, smell like? *To me it is a feeling of safety. I feel relieved and not scared. I feel like I don't have to be nervous. I am talked to like I am an old friend.*

How do we welcome the stranger among us? *I like to make them feel at ease. I might mention a few things to find out what they have in common with me or the church. (Heaven help them that they might be interested in aviation.) I invite them for the coffee time or give them the pamphlet explaining our beautiful windows if I am at church. Finding a common thread is a very good first start.*

What am I going to do to create a welcoming environment? *I need to be active and don't think someone else is going to greet someone new to our church. You don't have to be an extrovert to function as a warm and loving host. I thought about this at the conference in that for every meal I found someone sitting alone and that I did not know. Wow, is that a fun way to meet people and tell them about your church.*

Well now I hope I have sparked some interest and questions so let's go and greet people and make them feel like part of our family.
